Teen Pathfinder Taskforce

Recommendations to the NAD Pathfinder Committee January 9, 2005

- 1. Recommend the clarification that both teen Pathfinders and TLT's are a part of the whole Pathfinder program and not be considered separate organizations.
 - a. Unless the group of teens is quite large the teens and junior Pathfinders should meet as one club, and not as separate clubs. (Special outings/activities should be planned that involve only teens.)
 - b. The Teen Leaders in Training (TLT) program is designed for advanced/specialized training for teens, and not designed to be either a free-standing organization, or to include all Pathfinders of teen age.
- 2. Recommend that the requirements for Pathfinder membership be rewritten so that there is no maximum age for having to quit Pathfinders. (If a young person joins when he/she is of typical Pathfinder age [grades 5-10] and wishes to continue he/she may, and gradually will make the transition into becoming a helper/staff member).
- 3. Recommend that a resource booklet be developed to provide guidance and assistance to leaders of teen Pathfinders. (See attached outline)
- 4. Recommend that honors be developed and/or designated that can be earned only by Pathfinders of teen age.
- 5. Recommend that the NAD Pathfinder Committee request the appropriate NAD committee to develop seminars, presentations, and a booklet that deals with how to train church leaders to work specifically with teens.
- 6. Recommend that the NAD Pathfinder committee give study to the concept of having a portion of the Pathfinder uniform signify teens.
- 7. Recommend that the revised Pathfinder staff manual include a chapter on how to work with teens
- 8. Recommend that each club director be encouraged to appoint one or two teens to attend church board meetings, representing teen Pathfinder issues.
